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<u>DPH Updates</u>

High Quality IFSP Outcome Development Resources



As you are aware, DPH Regional Specialists have been going out to programs this fall/winter to collect and rate IFSP outcome data as part of the evaluation for the MA State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP). Programs have asked if the DPH Outcome Data Collection Sheet could be made available as a resource that could be used by programs with staff and during supervision. A folder has been created by DPH on the Early Intervention Training Center (EITC) website. Visit the Resources tab, and click on DPH Resources for MA Early Intervention Programs (files on Dropbox). There you will find a file called High Quality IFSP Outcomes; when you open it you will find the DPH FY18 Outcome Data Collection Sheet, as well

as a copy of the ECTA created placemat that includes the criteria defining high quality, participation-based, IFSP outcomes. In addition, there is a Grab & Go (online training module) called High Quality IFSP Outcomes available on the EITC website, under the Professional Development/Training Materials tab. It contains activities and resources on writing high quality IFSP outcome development that can be used for staff training.

SSP Autism Referral Process Webinar

The Committee's priority was to make the documents as user-friendly as possible, keeping them to one page and using the same format on each. The Committee plans to continue working along this line and will be developing a Transition document for each group; with completion planned for the spring. Zika Information and Update

Due to recent weather events devastating Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands, families from these areas are, and will continue to, move temporarily or permanently from these regions into Massachusetts. Because both Puerto Rico and the US Virgin islands were substantially affected by the Zika epidemic over the last couple of years, this means that we will probably have pregnant women that need to be tested for evidence of Zika virus infection during their pregnancy and infants that may have been impacted by congenital Zika virus infection. It is critical that we work together to make sure that pregnant women and infants receive appropriate testing, that families with affected infants get connected to the necessary support services and that women with laboratory evidence of Zika virus infection during pregnancy and infants with evidence of congenital Zika virus syndrome be reported to the Massachusetts Department of Public Health (MDPH) for enrollment in the US Zika Pregnancy Registry.

Please contact the MDPH's Division of Epidemiology and Immunization at our 24/7 number 617-983-6800 for testing requests, questions and to report pregnant women and infants. Families with congenitally affected infants can be referred to the MA Department of Public Health (DPH) Community Support Line at 1-800-882-1435 which provides information, technical assistance, and resources for families with children/ youth with special health needs and providers. The toll-free line is staffed by Resource Specialists with knowledge of public programs and other programs for which families may be eligible.

In addition, CDC has released updated recommendations for clinical evaluation of infants born to women with laboratory evidence of Zika virus infection during pregnancy and women with possible exposure to Zika virus during pregnancy.
