DPH Updates

Updated EI Service Delivery Reporting Requirements and Reimbursement for Service Manual (SDR manual) - July 1, 2018

The DPH has updated this manual to ensure that information is accurate and more user friendly. The target audience of the SDR manual is EI Billers and Program staff that have a role in the billing and SDR submission process. It is also meant to be a resource for Practice Management System Developers.

The updated manual will be shared with EI agencies and programs on June 1, 2018. This manual will include the new rates for FY19.

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Data Manager Updates

EIIS Evaluation Dates for Transferred Children

If a child is transferred to your EI program BOTH the "Date Tool First Used" AND the "Date Notified if Deemed Eligible/Ineligible" entered on the EIIS Evaluation form should match with the information given to you by the **previous** program. There are a number of transferred children being entered into EIIS where the "Date Tool First Used" occurs prior to the Referral Date but the "Date Notified if Deemed Eligible/Ineligible" occurs after the Referral Date. The "Date Notified if Deemed Eligible/Ineligible" begins the eligibility timeframe and should be accurate for all transferred children who are still eligible under a previous evaluation.

Data Quality

This month the webinar will present information about why we collect data and issues around data quality. As we begin to get ready for the development of the new EI Web-based system (EIIS/EIFS) it is important to ensure that our data accurately represents the work that is happening in the field.
