NCSEAM Family Survey Update

NCSEAM Family Surveys for distribution in **October 2018** and **March 2019** were shipped to each EI program on Tuesday, August 7.

Your program should receive the surveys by Wednesday, August 15 from Scantron. If you do not receive your program's Surveys by then, please contact Suzanne Gottlieb at <u>suzanne.gottlieb@state.ma.us</u> or your EI specialist as soon as possible, so that they can track them.

Also, please remember that your shipment contains enough Surveys for both the October and March distributions. Keep the Surveys not used in October somewhere safe for distribution in March. We base the number of Surveys each program receives on EIIS data current as of July 2018. We then add 10% to this to ensure that programs will have enough for both distributions. We do have some additional surveys at DPH should you need them.

<u>Specialty Services Update</u>

Specialty Service Provider Contacts Updated

The updated directories of <u>Specialty Service Providers for Autism</u> and <u>Deaf/Hard of Hearing Providers</u> are now available. It should be noted that while the information for all programs is contained in these documents, not all SSPs are available to contract with all EIPs. You can always find updated Directory information in the MA EI Dropbox. If you have any questions about contract options for your EIP, please contact Joan Rafferty.

The SSP Autism providers are a list of <u>15 DPH approved programs</u> available to contract with EI Programs. Programs are generally assigned to specific catchment areas.

The Deaf/Hard of Hearing directory lists <u>9 Specialty Providers</u> that offer Parent Infant Programs in addition to other services. Specific information about each SSP is listed in this directory, as there are differences in intervention strategies as well as geographic considerations. Included in this directory are 3 additional resources that provide other services to children who are Deaf/Hard of Hearing, such as evaluations, information and referrals.

Please pay particular attention to the information in the directory regarding **Horace Mann School for the Deaf and Hard of Hearing. This program is unique in that it is part of Boston Public Schools, therefore, services are not billed. As these services are not supported by Part C funds, different documentation is required on the IFSP Service Delivery Page. If you have any children receiving services from Horace Mann School, please consult the Directory for guidance as to completion of the IFSP Service Delivery Page. SSP Autism Surveys

Thank you to EIPs and SSPs for completing the ASD data collection surveys that were sent to both groups. The majority of programs have responded, but if you have not completed the survey, please do so as soon as possible. All programs that have not completed the survey will be contacted. It is vitally important to have information from everyone in order to make informed decisions about capacity statewide, and particularly in various regions across the state.

Once data collection and analysis is complete, the results and any recommendations will be shared with the field.

New Video Quiz: How Safe Sleep Savvy Are You?



A teaching Tool for reducing infant sleep related deaths.

Around 3,500 babies die from sleep-related deaths every year. We can change those numbers by having better conversations with caregivers about what safe sleep recommendations look like and why following them can save a baby's life.

To help support and spark those conversations, we've developed **this short video quiz** that reviews recommended safe sleep practices. The quiz is not a test; instead, **it is an interactive teaching tool to help health professionals engage families in conversations about what safe sleep looks like and why it is important.**

The video shows eight different scenes and asks viewers to identify safe and unsafe behaviors. Explanations and recommendations are provided for each scene so that participants gain needed knowledge as they go.

Physicians, nurses, home visitors and other public health professionals can sit side-by-side with caregivers while they take the quiz, review any questions and discuss best-practices.
