## <u>DPH Updates</u>

#### Transportation

DPH has been working closely with the Human Services Transportation (HST) related to recent transportation issues. In the context of our discussions we have identified the need to update the current Transportation Standards and some of the current forms to accurately reflect what is happening in the field. We have established a small internal work group to collaborate with HST in reviewing and revising the DPH transportation standards and the current Transportation Request Form (TR). The goal will be to have the revised Transportation Standards completed by July 1, 2019.

In addition, HST would like to remind EI programs that it is critical when submitting a Transportation Request (TR), if the child is MassHealth eligible, to please include the MMIS number (MMIS number is the member's 12 digit id number printed on the card) on the TR and at the same time you submit the PT-1.
